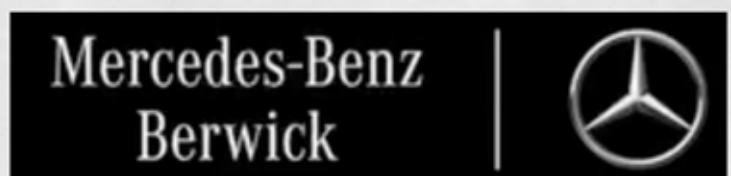
Veterans

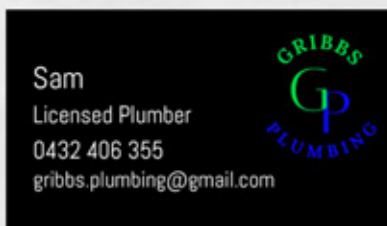

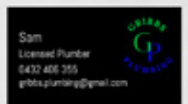
